Judgement criteria

Nominations will be shortlisted against the following three criteria:

1. How youth-led was your campaign? How have you ensured the voices of young people are represented at all stages? Tell us about design, delivery and evaluation.
2. What impact has your campaign had at a personal, age group or organisation wide level? How have you measured this?
3. How do you plan to use the prize money to continue and/or develop your anti-bullying work? You may include plans for remote activity or for face-to-face activity to be delivered when possible in the coming year.
